Grammar Bingo: Advanced Level

Instructions:

This bingo game can be played at intermediate or advanced level depending on your students' abilities. This particular bingo game is a review of a variety of parts of speech taught over a period of time. There are 4 different cards so that students can have fun playing their own cards rather than all having the same one

Instructions

- 1) Pass around a variety of bingo grammar cards
- 2) Provide players with chips or bits of coloured paper to cover squares
- 3) Tell players you want a complete line horizontal or vertical (any way you want)
- 4) Caller begins by calling out a part of speech from the call out sheet. Students then try to find an example of that part of speech on their card.

Example:

Caller:	Player
Does anyone have a adjective?	Late

- 5) Once student has a line, they should call out "Bingo!"
- 6) Verify students' choices for accuracy.
