Guess the Job



Guess the Job A speaking activity

Instructions:

- Cut the clues up.
- Put the stack of job clues in the middle of a group of 3 -6 students.
- Have each student take a turn reading a clue.
- After the clue is read, have the students guess what job the clue is for.
- The first student to identify the job (or best answer) keeps the card.
- The game ends when the cards are finished.
- The student with the most cards wins.

Note: It is a great opportunity for students to explain their ideas.

Note: This is a good game to use after they have studied occupation vocabulary. If they are a lower class it is nice for them to have a list of jobs that they can use to refer to as they play the game.
